I appreciate a people given to ministry in the ways you exhibited it so graciously during, and after, disaster. I appreciate your heart and love shown for your neighbors.

No one can deny that 2020 was a transitional year in our society because of the Covid-19 virus, civil unrest, and the growing animosity towards Christianity. The future looks bleak for the church and believers in Christ. Many people and churches have taken the word "Christian" and have distorted its meaning and changed it to fit their lifestyle or culture instead of following Biblical standards. Therefore to call yourself a "Christian" depends on your own personal morals or denominational affiliation. The Christian Band, Degarmo & Key must have recognized this trend when they wrote this song over 30 years ago. We are living "Life in the New Age."

1st Timothy 4:1-3: "The Spirit clearly says that in later times some will abandon the faith and follow deceiving spirits and things taught by demons. Such teachings come through hypocritical liars, whose consciences have been seared as with a hot iron. They forbid people to marry and order them to abstain from certain foods, which God created to be received with thanksgiving by those who believe and who know the truth."

Apostasy seems to be the growing trend in today's culture. The term comes from the Greek word "Apostasia" meaning defection, departure, revolt or rebellion. It has become a theological category describing those who have voluntarily and consciously abandoned their faith in God and in His Son, Jesus Christ. GA'S HEARTBEAT BILL FAQS

What is the difference between abortion and miscarriage?

According to GA HB481 section 3, "abortion means the act of using, prescribing, or administering any instrument, substance, device, or other means with the purpose to terminate a pregnancy with knowledge that termination will, with reasonable likelihood, cause the death of an unborn child." Abortion is the intentional termination of pregnancy. According to the Mayo Clinic, a "miscarriage is the sudden loss of a pregnancy before the 20th week."

In GA HB481 Section 4, the law states "any such act shall not be considered an abortion if the act is performed to remove a dead child caused by spontaneous abortion (i.e., miscarriage) or removing an ectopic pregnancy." Therefore, treating a miscarriage does not qualify as an abortion because the child is already deceased.

Does GA HB481 prohibit doctors from treating women who have an incomplete abortion?

No. A chemical abortion (i.e., the abortion pill) results in an incomplete abortion when some of the fetal tissue remains inside the mother. This can result in severe bleeding, hemorrhagic shock, or sepsis, which can be fatal for the mother. In this case, the baby no longer has a heartbeat, and medical intervention would not be considered an abortion but a lifesaving measure for the mother.

Does GA Law HB481 prosecute women in GA for having an abortion?

No, no state in the US currently prosecutes women for having an abortion. Therefore, women who have complications from an abortion should seek immediate medical care.
